

MEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM PRACTICES SERVICE LEARNING

Starting the season by winning 12 of their first 14 games and balancing school with a busy six-day-a-week practice schedule, the Sinclair Tartan Pride men's basketball team manages to still find time to volunteer and give back to the community in a variety of different ways.

Recently, the team spent time with veterans at the Dayton Veterans Affairs Medical Center. Players visited each floor, spending time with veterans and their families.

In some cases, veterans related to players with their own experiences.

"One vet told us his story of how he had been captured and held prisoner for 22 months," freshman player Darrell Bullock said. "You'd think he would have given up hope, but he was rescued. He was telling us if we live right, we'll live long."

Head Coach Jeff Price said it's the small connections the players make with the veterans that really matter.

"Sometimes you see this stuff on TV; with our guys, we try to get them face to face," he said. "It's one thing to read about it, it's another to stand beside it."

Freshman player Deiontay Walters said many of the veterans wished players luck during the season.

"A lot of them seemed really

happy to talk to us," Walters said. "A few said they'd come out to watch a game."

Apart from visiting at the VA, the team has also volunteered at the Boys and Girls Club of Dayton, a youth organization for 6 to 18 year olds. Last November, players served a Thanksgiving dinner to some of the children who then got to meet the team up close.

"A lot of them just viewed us as someone older who was taking time out of his day to do something good for someone else," sophomore player Corbin Bates said. "We all really enjoyed it."

Bullock agrees.

"You never know what someone's circumstances are at home — serving them felt good," he said.

The team also works with Generation Dayton, a networking organization of local business professionals hosted by the Dayton Chamber of Commerce. Every May, players and more than 150 members of Generation Dayton perform acts of community service in Dayton that range from painting fences, cleaning up downtown by sweeping streets and helping to renovate buildings.

"We put our young guys next to professionals, it helps them to interact and to network," Price said.

Other charitable events the team has been a part of in the past range from answering phones for the

Muscular Dystrophy Association's fundraising telethon, to participating in the Dayton Heart Walk for the Dayton Children's Hospital.

The team also manages to give back on the court as well, by helping the local Oakwood Youth Basketball League, with some players periodically acting as assistant coaches for kids in the third through sixth grade.

First year team member C.J. Reed said he gets a lot of enjoyment from working with the younger players.

"We help them with fundamentals like passing and dribbling, mostly the basics. They love it," he said.

Price said a few of the Oakwood players have attended Sinclair

games, while some of the Sinclair players have gone to Oakwood games to cheer on the youth.

"They become connected, and that's what's important," he said. "Our players are the same type and quality of athletes you see on TV, but here at Sinclair you can get up close to our athletes; you can get close to the court and the action."

Bullock looks at it as a way to help them.

"We're just trying to get them better, trying to get them to the next level, just like we're trying to do," Bullock said.

During 2014, Price said his team has every intention of continuing to be as successful off the court as they've been on it.

Jazz Ensemble Concert held at Sinclair

The first Jazz Ensemble concert of the spring semester will feature Music department faculty member Bruce Jordan.

Jordan said he loves performance and having the opportunity to direct the jazz ensemble at Sinclair Community College.

Apart from being a director, Jordan said he is a true performer.

"Performers live for the audience and for the audience response," he said. "If you go through the entire concert, for instance, and you get a standing ovation at the end of it, there's just nothing like it — it makes all the hard work worth it."

Jordan will be playing the saxophone during the concert.

"I'm big on performance so any chance I get to perform, I take it," he said. "We generally have five saxophones in the saxophone section, and for this concert one of them gets off the hook and I play the main saxophone parts."

During the concert, nine different pieces will be performed, including one from Maynard Ferguson, who is known for the theme song in the movie "Rocky."

"This concert takes me about a year to put together because I have to choose different pieces and contrasting styles," he said. "There are different varieties, different tempos and different levels of excitement."

The Jazz Ensemble features both community members and students on campus.

"The community members skill levels are high because they have generally been playing a long time," Jordan said. "So the students who make this group skill levels are also very high, it's really incredible."

Jordan said because of the diversity of members, it often can create a better product on stage.

"A big motivator for students is that they are sitting next to an experienced person," he said. "If they can train next to an experienced person, the level of awesome increases, it's a really good motivator."

The concert will be Friday, Jan. 24 at 8 p.m. in Blair Hall Theatre and will only last about an hour and a half.

"It's a free concert and if you haven't seen this group, give it a try," he said. "I think you'll find a lot of levels of excitement, joy and soul in this performance."

Jordan is a graduate of Indiana University with a master's degree in Music Performance and has previously played in Germany at the Fachakademie fur Musik, Nurnberg.

"I'm incredibly proud of the ensemble," he said. "For somebody like me, who is a performer, to have such an outstanding performing group is just great."



Adam Newhouser, a 26-year-old hiker who has covered a lot of ground.

Why he's interesting...

Thirty-mile-days don't daunt Newhouser anymore.

At 26, Newhouser has already hiked the Appalachian Trail, south to north, in its entirety. As an experienced "thru-hiker," he's grown used to the outdoors.

"A thru-hiker is someone who attempts to hike the entire trail in one go," Newhouser said. "Thousands start out every year. Only about one in four make it."

The Appalachian Trail spans from Springer Mountain, Georgia up to Mount Katahdin in Maine, bringing the total distance to around 2,200 miles. It can take thru-hikers anywhere from five to eight months to complete the hike.

"I'm sure it sounds daunting to those who aren't used to the idea," Newhouser said.

"But when you're out there you never think 'okay, only 2,000 more miles to go.' You set daily goals for yourself, like covering 20 miles in one day."

Newhouser is in his second year studying alternative energy solutions at Sinclair Community College. He said the time off he took to complete his thru-hikes has helped him realize what he wanted to do for a living.

"I went to college right after high school like you're supposed to," he said. "But back then I had no idea what I wanted to do. The idea of racking up debt didn't really appeal to me and I couldn't afford to do any major traveling. It was around then I started reading about the Appalachian Trail."

In 2007, after a winter of working and saving, Newhouser withdrew from school and embarked on the first long distance hike of his life.

"My first time out, I got a pretty hard slap in the face," he said. "I realized pretty quickly that there was a lot I didn't know. I was pretty miserable for the first few weeks."

Within a week of being on the trail, Newhouser had dealt with torrential rainstorms, a busted shoelace, mice, a black bear and a broken water filter.

"It was like some unseen force was trying to get me to quit before I had even hiked 100 miles," he said. "I just kept reminding myself that I had to do this. I had quit school and quit my job — if I just gave up and went home, there wouldn't be anything waiting for me."

After making it nearly 75 miles through Georgia, Newhouser recalls when his outlook turned around.

"It was when I got my trail name," he said.


Many thru-hikers on the Appalachian Trail join in the tradition of picking a "trail name" for themselves. Basically a nickname, trail names are used among hikers to sign trail logs.

"My trail name was Bear Pack, which was given to me by fellow thru-hikers after they witnessed a small black bear come to our camp, snatch my bag and scurry off with it," Newhouser said. "I remember thinking 'that's my whole life in there.' So I ran after it screaming and waving my hiking poles. I did everything you're not supposed to do. But it worked, the bear dropped my bag and I got it back. I figured nothing could scare me after that. Not on the trail, not even in life."



sudoku puzzle



The objective of the game is to fill all the blank squares in a game with the correct numbers. There are three very simple constraints to follow. In a 9 by 9 square Sudoku game:

- Every row of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order.
- Every column of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order.
- Every 3 by 3 subsection of the 9 by 9 square must include all digits 1 through 9.

Every Sudoku game begins with some squares already filled in, and the difficulty of each game is due to how many squares are filled in. The more squares that are known, the easier it is to figure out which numbers go in the open squares. As you

fill in squares correctly, options for the remaining squares are narrowed and it becomes easier to fill them in.

Sudoku Tips: Start by looking for numbers that occur frequently in the initial puzzle. For example, say you have a lot of 5's in the initial puzzle. Look for the 3x3 box where there is no 5. Look for 5's in other rows and columns that can help you eliminate where the 5 might go in that box.

If there is a 5 in column's 1 and 2, then there can't be a 5 anywhere else in either of those columns. You know then that whatever leftmost 3x3 box that is missing a 5 must have it go in column 3. If you can eliminate all the possibilities in that box except for 1 square, you've got it down!

Bob Cottrell is a businessman and class of 1987 Sinclair alumnus.

Cottrell said he was never certain of what he wanted to do growing up.

"I still don't know," he said. "I like information technology, but if I had to do it all over again I think I would have become a lawyer or a doctor. You can start your own company that way and control your own destiny."

Cottrell said IT was a good career in the 1980s, but in this day and age, we have a lot going on.

"Now we have too much offshore going on," he said. "It drives the salaries down for everybody. You really can't stand up and haggle with your boss anymore, because you have nothing to haggle about — there are always guys who will work cheaper."

Cottrell holds two degrees, an associate from Sinclair in Computer Sci-

ence, and a bachelor's degree from Capital University in Management Information Systems. These degrees allowed him to focus on his favorite aspect of business.

"I like being the liaison between IT and the business folks, which is kind of a high tech business analyst," he said. "You have to have a lot of IT background, but you also have to know how to talk the talk when you're writing business requirements for the business folks. They don't know IT and honestly, IT doesn't want to go out and pull the requirements from the business side."

Cottrell said in order to succeed you have to take the bad situations along with the good.

"You can take a bad situation and turn it around to your benefit. You have to be aggressive — when something pops up you have to grab it," Cottrell said. "No one wants the hot potato but if you take it, people remember that."

Cottrell's job as a system analyst consists of him controlling the interfaces out to the third party administrators.

"It's busy, but I like it. I have an office, but I typically only go in if I have laptop issues or there's a meeting or something like that," he said. "The majority of the time I work from home. It saves on a lot of gas and a lot of those eight, nine dollar lunches."

Cottrell first went into the Marine Corps for four years to get his college benefits. After the Corps, he tried out factory work and then realized he wanted something better for himself —

that was when he turned to Sinclair.

"I wanted to do something better for myself; I wanted to get a more professional degree, so I thought — there's nothing wrong with being a computer programmer," he said. "You go to work clean, you work all day and you go home clean."

Cottrell's time at Sinclair proved pivotal to his success.

"I was pretty young back then, and to me it was a good experience," he said. "Typically at Sinclair you meet a few people in class then go home, at least I was that way. I didn't want to hang out with them but I also worked — that's why I went to Sinclair because I didn't have a lot of free time — I was working four security jobs at once."

Cottrell believes the key ingredient of any success, be it in the business world or at Sinclair, is ones appetite for achievement.

"You can't sit back if you want to be successful. Now-a-days the competition is too tough, you have to be very aggressive," he said. "If there's a project out there and no one's taking ownership of it, you need to step up and take it otherwise you're just another cog in a wheel. It's just the nature of the beast; you have to do it, because there are always other people who will if you won't."

Overall, Cottrell said he is happy with his life.

"I've got a good career and in another 15 years, maybe I'll retire," he said. "I enjoy my job a lot and I can't see myself quitting. If you like your job, that's a big part of the battle."

Women's basketball update

After losing four starters and a head coach from last season, the Sinclair Community College women's basketball team had work to do and shoes to fill.

Assistant men's Basketball Coach Marcus Stewart was promoted to women's head coach to fill the void left by 10-year veteran Jeff Dillon, and although he has taken a different approach to coaching the team, the transition has been

seamless.

"My goal going into the season was to expand the program in the community, develop my players and compete within the conference," Stewart said.

The Lady Tartans to date have registered a 7-8 record overall, including two losses to nationally ranked teams.

Over the semester break, the team competed twice and broke even at 1-1, facing additional adversity with cancelled games and the temporary loss of sophomore guard Ashley

Morrow.

"Ashley is our overall best player ... even so, one of our strengths is our depth on the wings, where we have four players averaging 15 points per game," Stewart said.

Freshman guard JeNae Curtiss leads the team in scoring and rebounding at 16.8 ppg and 7.8 rpg respectively, and Osha' Owens the assist leader with 3.7 apg.

"If we continue to improve, I like the direction this team is headed," Stewart said.






The meaning of life — in a class on death

The day before a 16-year-old friend of mine was murdered, she kissed the window of her white sedan, a birthday gift, leaving cranberry-colored stains on the glass. Then she gave me a hug goodbye. Her name was Sangeeta Lal, and the next morning, her ex-boyfriend shot her.

It was April 19, 1995, the same day as the Oklahoma City bombings, and while the world media tuned in to the images of bloody babies and building carcasses left behind by the attack in Oklahoma, I found myself, 16 and a high school newspaper reporter, reporting on my community's own domestic terror.

I interviewed Sangeeta's neighbors, who told me how she escaped from a bedroom window as her assailant chased her with a gun. How she pounded on a neighbor's sliding-glass door, begging for someone to let her in, but no one did. How he shot her in the chest, on a dew-covered patch of grass, before the sun rose. It was the first murder I covered as a journalist. And for the next 16 years, I carried her short life with me like a responsibility.

I went on to pay for college by working nights at a local newspaper as an obituary writer, and spent the decade after that in newspapers, standing on the sidelines of other people's grief many times. Nearly every reporter has had to figure out how to grasp the horrors and miseries that we cover. But for me, the tragedies I covered took a toll. In 2008, after writ-

ing an article on a death education class, I decided to enroll in it myself.

"Death in Perspective," at Kean University in Union, N.J., is led by Norma Bowe, a nurse with a background in health and psychology. In her class, students watch autopsies, listen to lectures in cemeteries and talk to murderers, funeral directors and hospice patients.

Students also write goodbye letters. Mine was addressed to Sangeeta, but it touched on a lot of the grief I had seen.

Here's part of that letter: "How can a drive-by bullet intended for a gang member end up lodged in a 3-year-old's chest?"

"Why did that mother, who waved farewell to her 25-year-old daughter, who was headed to work on the 93rd floor of the World Trade Center's North Tower on Sept. 11, 2001, never get to see her again?"

"I have written about all of these people. I have sat with victims, survivors, family members and friends of the dead also trying to grapple with why. I have cried with them. My thoughts often come back to you. I don't know if I will ever understand."

Enrolling in the death class was an expression of my need to exercise control over death's indiscriminate grip. What I was trying to do — what I think we were all trying to do in that class — was to become a little bit less vulnerable.

Bowe embraces the theories of the psychologist Erik Erikson, like this one: Birth and death are inextricably bound. Virtues like hope are either nurtured or neglected through the stages of an individual's life, and offer hints of how

an adult might eventually die — whether hanging on with regret and despair (bad death), or feeling fulfillment in the end, and simply letting go (good death).

Bowe's death class is the most popular course on campus, with a three-year waiting list. Some students enroll out of curiosity, but the class also attracts students who are hurting, searching or trying to heal. The students in my class brought with them stories of suicides, murders, mental illnesses, cancer diagnoses, car crashes and drug overdoses. The deaths of people's pets received the same respect as the deaths of grandmothers. Beneath each grim tale, there was resilience.

A mutual understanding exists in Bowe's classes that death is something we all have in common.

Bowe's lessons went beyond the morbid and into the meaning of life. She had been abused as a child, yet she learned to march through life with a cloak of invincibility. She was determined to teach us too, how to turn hardship into human connectivity. On a hospice field trip, I watched an elderly, paraplegic, dying man regale twenty-somethings with stories of his life working on a tugboat. World weary as I had become over the years, I couldn't help but see the value in these experiential life lessons.

Bowe believed that having a good death also came in part from building "generativity," a term that Erickson coined for what we give back to the world, create and leave behind.

After I finished the class, I wasn't quite done with

the experience. I spent the next three years shadowing Bowe and her students for a book on a remarkable woman and her students. In July, I finished the book. Four days later, I went into labor.

My daughter was 10 days past due and my amniotic fluid was dangerously low. Doctors were concerned when I started inexplicably bleeding and developed a fever. Then the baby's heartbeat became erratic. I wept as they wheeled me away for an emergency C-section. It was the closest I had ever come to dying, and now this little person inside of me was in danger too.

So it was a wave of relief when my husband held up our healthy, curly haired daughter for me to see. She looked at him calmly, almost wisely, and then at me. I marveled in disbelief at our puffy-faced creation before doctors whisked her away for tests.

Over the years, I had wondered whether I even wanted to have kids. The world I reported on was too unpredictable, too cruel. I am still terrified of bringing up my daughter in a place with such dark corners. But I realize now how much I would have missed out on in life had I chosen to forfeit love out of fear.

Erikson once wrote: "Healthy children will not fear life if their elders have integrity enough to not fear death."

I think I understand now.

My daughter was my leap of faith. Now, I am utterly vulnerable. And that is something I am learning to live with as I stare for too long at the threads of her eyelashes and the rising and falling of her fragile chest.

How the budget becomes law

After a string of ugly political battles, a shutdown and a deal, Congress still has work to do


Even in the best political climate, drafting and passing a federal budget takes about 18 months. But when Washington is as polarized as it has been over the past few years, the process can become even longer and messier. Legislators lurched from crisis to crisis as they tried to craft a budget for 2014, with battles erupting over the Affordable Care Act, deficit reduction and the debt ceiling. The fighting culminated in October's 16-day partial government shutdown, which ended just before the nation would have defaulted on its debt. Congress finally passed a bipartisan budget deal in December. Even though President Barack Obama signed it, Congress still must approve bills this month that distribute money to federal agencies. Here's a look at the tortured path Congress took to get to this point.

What made 2013 challenging

A turbulent mix of economic and political factors combined to make the most recent budget cycle more contentious than usual, said Jo Comerford, executive director of the National Priorities Project, a nonpartisan think tank focused on the federal budget; factors which played an especially large roles in the fight:

A polarized Congress

Battles over spending led to the sequester budget cuts, brushes with the debt ceiling, the partial government shutdown in October and a reliance on continuing resolutions to fund government operations



A polarized public

The political divide in the U.S. has lessened the influence of moderates in Congress; the budget process makes it difficult for voters to hold lawmakers accountable for their budgetary decisions, Comerford said



The tea party

Congressional Republicans with ties to the tea party have pushed for deep spending cuts and led the fight to shut down the government over the health care law, against the wishes of some party leaders






Lingering policy issues

Major events of the past decade — from the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq to the recession and economic stimulus plans — have had significant effects on government spending and the country's political climate




How the budget process should work

Drafting and implementing the federal budget generally takes about 18 months and is split into three broad phases, according to the U.S. Congressional Research Service




The twisted path to a 2014 budget
